The Synod of Bishops will resume meeting in Rome this October. During the school Mass at church last Tuesday, one of the students asked me, "What are those rails for?" Yes, we have installed rails! For those sitting in the back of church, you may not have noticed. In fact, for those sitting in the front of church, you also may not have noticed. They blend in perfectly with the rest of the church so they look like they were always there. These are a much-welcomed addition for any of us needing to get up those tricky couple of steps to the ambo and lectern or to assist with Holy Communion. As I told the student, for some of us "older" parishioners, they help us from tripping up or down the stairs. During that same Mass, Father asked if anyone noticed the anchor in front of the altar. He said the anchor is used for keeping a ship steady in the water, much like Christ keeps us steady on our journey. I couldn't help but look at the rails and think, now we have Christ, the anchor, AND the rails to help steady the way as we journey through this Lenten season.
